We invited the officer to have lunch after she was finished helping the Duke Power workers and I just remember how nice she was and how good it made us all feel. 


Time Capsule Update

As you know about 25 years ago, we buried a time capsule, which for various reasons, we have been unable to locate. So, we have decided to plan better for another time capsule to be opened 50 years from now, but this one will not be buried! Pastor Randy is building a wooden box which will be sealed and maintained in our church library (located next to Pastor Randy's office). We will have a plaque made with details of when it is to be opened that will be attached to the box.

That said, now we need to begin the process of collecting our items for the box. Time Capsule items should help commemorate the church's history and values for future generations. Our Ministry Team will be responsible for collecting and including a number of items such as: the 225th banner which we've all been signing since our anniversary celebrations, bulletins, newsletters church directory, and other pertinent church documents.

We'd like for everyone to include at least one item. These could include: a hand written letter or message to the future, a family picture (*please limit the size to a 5x7 and place inside a zip lock to preserve over time*), money (*may not exist in the future*/ *could use empty pill bottles for coins, zip locks for bills*). We'll collect items in a tub in the church library. Exact date and time for sealing the time capsule will be announced towards the end of December, possibly as a New Year's Eve gathering!

Wreaths for Our Veterans' Graves

American Legion Riders Post 31 of North Wilkesboro sponsors Wreaths for Veterans Graves each year here in Wilkes County. Their mission is to "Remember the fallen, Honor those who serve, and Teach the next generation the value of freedom." This year Union UMC chose to participate by purchasing a wreath to place on the grave of each veteran buried in our cemetery to honor and remember our deceased veterans.

We have purchased 43 wreaths at a cost of \$5 per wreath which will be placed on each of the graves listed on page 5 on Sunday, December 14th, immediately after worship service. If you would like to stay and watch, or help as the wreaths are placed on the graves. The wreaths are a 20" Frasier Fir with a red bow.

This list was complied based on the information we had available in our cemetery records, researching online and discussions with church members. If anyone has information concerning a family member that was a veteran that is not included on our list, please know this was not our intention. If you will, please reach out to Pastor Randy or Sissie Church with that information so we can update our records to ensure that we include them in the future!
